This Sunday's Reflection is written by Fr Peter Coxe of the L'Arche Community in Bognor.

After record 17 Sundays (Lent, Eastertide, Trinity, Corpus Christi, Sts Peter and Paul), we're back in "Ordinary" time! "Ordinary" refers to "order" of time: from Sunday after Epiphany counting upwards before Lent; after Pentecost counting upwards towards Saturday Week 34, eve of Advent Sunday (nearest to 30 November, to give 4 Sundays before Christmas)

70 weeks in L'Arche help me sense Jesus' new "order" in today's readings resulting from Jesus coming, birth, suffering, death, resurrection, ascension, sending the Holy Spirit, revealing 3-Person-God, present under appearance of bread and wine, sending Apostles.

1) A new mother's previous "world-order" collapses as she "orders" all energy around her baby. Her new "world-order" is heartfelt love, nursing her baby. To hearers lamenting exile-chaos, Isaiah promises a new "order," intimacy between motherly God and God's people

2) Paul's Greek suggests "marching orders:" strict law, ritual and circumcision observance or non-Jewish Roman cultural compliance. Paul finds such loyalties irrelevant, being dead to the old "world-order" and "ordering" himself around Jesus' death and resurrection

3. Many hard workers today or 1st-century farmers and merchants "order" themselves around comfortable homes, clothing and good food. Jesus turns such priorities upside down. WE, his envoys, "order" ourselves around revealing his new "world-order:" love, fairness, community, inclusiveness, *Shalom* (= *peace, prosperity, healthy relationship with God and neighbour*) *Shalom* isn't absence of painful struggle. It's deep, realistic calm, sure knowledge Jesus has overcome the old chaotic "order" of selfishness

Feeling fear, we behave calmly. Sensing anger, we channel it creatively, like envoys shaking off dust, asserting inconvenient truth without aggression. To what extent do we "order" our lives around Jesus' new "order" of *Shalom* or our old chaotic selfish "world-order"?
