A virtue we don't often speak about is chastity. And that's a pity, because it's an important virtue. It's tempting to say it's counter-cultural—but I don't think that's true. Our society is only too aware of the devastating harmfulness of abuse of all sorts. The #MeToo movement has rightly caught public attention. Everyone knows about the painfulness of family breakdown. Everyone knows it's wrong to cheat on your husband or wife—or your boyfriend or girlfriend. So I think our society cares deeply about chastity. And that's something we as Christians should build on. The fact that Jesus stands for marital fidelity—with exactly equal standards for men and women—and condemns lustful looks as "adultery in the heart" (Matt 5:28) makes Jesus very relevant today.

However, where it touches people's personal lives, they can think quite differently. It's so easy to slip into a mentality of "it doesn't hurt anybody". But all big sins begin with little sins. Unchastity hurts us; it damages us and coarsens us. It can also be an area where people put up a barrier to God. God can teach about lots of things ... but He's not really welcome in that part of my life.

But if we do open ourselves to the Lord's guidance in this area of our lives, and bring it to His gentle and encouraging sacrament of Reconciliation when we need to, there is wonderful peace and happiness to be found, growth in authentic self-esteem and personal holiness—and love of the Lord.
