Education, Families, and Youth Ministry

The Catholic Certificate in Religious Studies (CCRS) is an engaging and effective way to learn about our faith

The CCRS is a fantastic way to deepen and expand your understanding of the Catholic faith. The course aims to ensure that participants have a comprehensive knowledge and understanding of the beliefs of the Catholic Church and is a valuable qualification for people involved in (or hoping to be involved) Religious Education in schools, Parish Catechesis and other ministries in the Church, or those wishing to develop their personal understanding of the Catholic faith.

The CCRS has been structured to be affordable and accessible and takes place at The St Philip Howard in Crawley on Saturdays. It includes some online content and is made up of eight modules: six core and two specialist modules. Each module requires ten hours of Course time and an assignment. The Bishop is very appreciative of all those who offer to assist him in this vital task - you will be encouraged to attend training sessions and will be fully supported in your role.

Join a Grandparents' Group

'We aim to keep prayer at the heart of family life so that our grandchildren will grow up aware of the goodness of God and His love for them.'

Our parish-based Grandparents' Groups provide an important opportunity for people to come together through prayer, learning, encouragement and friendship. We welcome everyone, including honorary grandparents who play an important role in many families' lives. Most groups meet once a month, after Mass, and begin with tea or coffee. Meetings offer an opportunity to pray, share news, plan events or days out, support one another, and reflect.

Grandparents' Groups have two large diocesan events each year, an annual pilgrimage to the shrine at West Grinstead and a formation event where we explore the skills needed to enable us to support our children and grandchildren in an enriched way - this year's formation event was a virtual tea party led by Fr Stephen Ortiger. While each of our groups is different, they have a common purpose; to enrich the lives of our grandchildren and help our families flourish in faith.

Opportunities from our Liturgy & Music Adviser

The Diocese offers a range of formation opportunities, providing training for readers, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, RCIA catechists, children's liturgy leaders, sacristans and musicians among others.

Are you involved in a small group? **With Hearts and Minds** is a resource for small groups, intended to help participants develop a deeper appreciation of the nature and role of the Liturgy in the life of the Christian community. Through reflection on the scriptures, the teaching of the Church and on our own experience, these can help to develop both our understanding of the Mass and a liturgical spirituality. THE CHERISH Life Network

The Diocese has an established Cherish Life Network for people interested in the defence of human life. The network recognises concerns about essential, lifesustaining care and treatment at all stages of life and aims to steer people who have those concerns towards the guidance and support they need.

We are engaged: working together to counter ongoing moves to legalise assisted suicide.

We give witness: opposing the ongoing campaign to legalise abortion without restriction, up to birth. We campaign against this for babies and their mothers, mindful that such moves could potentially deny women the opportunity to explore alternatives and leave them vulnerable to coercion.

We seek to help: we recognise that women sometimes seek an abortion through a lack of practical or emotional support. We aim to assist organisations who offer such support, as well as those who provide comfort and healing after an abortion.

- Delivering enrichment opportunities and enabling couples to explore the riches that lie within their relationship.




Can you help us to support our Bishop's ministry in a special way?

Fundraising helps our parishes to continue their mission of faith

Helping your church to raise money through fundraising is a wonderful way to ensure your parish can cover its running costs and continue its important mission of faith. Fundraising opportunities vary in size and scope, contact your parish priest if you would like to help with the following types of fundraising activity:

- Encouraging people to sign up to Gift Aid, if they are eligible.
- Promoting Standing Orders within your parish.
- Helping your parish priest with a Planned Giving Programme.
- Researching and/or managing Contactless Giving in your parish.
- Helping with Second Collections.
- Attending the diocesan online Annual Volunteer Forum Gift Aid and Fundraising presentation on the 30th October 2021.

Our Fundraising Officer works closely with parishes to help with all aspects of parish fundraising, offering 1:1 Zoom meetings with Parish Finance Committees to discuss what churches can do to increase their income. Support your parish priest with finance, administration and property

Every parish has a Finance Committee to advise their Parish Priest on matters of expenditure, fundraising, property and financial planning. This team includes a Gift Aid Organiser, the Health and Safety representative and people with bookkeeping or accounting experience as well as those with property expertise. The Parish Priest appoints individuals to these roles with training and support provided by the Finance, HR and Property Office in Hove, who are able to introduce the cloud-based systems used to help parishes track their accounts, claim Gift Aid and manage health and safety. Let your priest know if you have skills to contribute in these areas.

Safeguarding Reps play a central role in parish life

Our Diocese is committed to the safeguarding of all. As part of this commitment each of our parishes must ensure that it has a Safeguarding Representative - or where possible, a small safeguarding team - in place. Becoming a Safeguarding Rep can be extremely rewarding, allowing role holders to support their parish and learn new skills. Reps play a pivotal role within the Catholic Safeguarding Structure providing an important link between our churches and the diocesan Safeguarding Coordinator. They are responsible for promoting good and safe practices in all activities involving children, young people and adults and for providing advice on child and adult safeguarding matters within their parish.

- All Reps are given training to ensure they understand national policies and procedures and know who to contact if a concern or allegation is raised.
- They have a key role in the administration of the safer recruitment process, including facilitating the DBS Disclosure process at a local level.
