Current COVID arrangements:

Please, if possible, continue to wear a face covering during Mass, sanitise hands on entry and exit, and participate in the voluntary track and trace list. The church is open every day for private prayer. Face coverings are required for private prayer in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel, but not required in the main part of the church.

Children's Liturgy has restarted at 10am Mass, and parish coffee re-starts after 10am Mass THIS weekend.

The formal obligation to Sunday Mass has not yet been reinstated, but the Bishops of England & Wales have written to all Catholics encouraging them to honour Sunday and make a decision in conscience about attending Mass. If you've made it back to the shops, gym, work, club, etc, then making it back to church should also be a priority. Central to the teaching of the Second Vatican Council is understanding the Church to be the Pilgrim People of God. We journey, bishops and people, together. For this to be true, there must be true dialogue and active listening. And therefore, the Church is Synodal, by nature and by definition. The current Synod, or more fully, the Synodal Path to 2023, is but one, current expression of this pilgrim church. Synod is not something we do and then move on. It is, or should be, part of our continued Church identity.

Once released those who have suffered detention can be very isolated in the community and many are not able to access services. They tell us that the devices have been really helpful for their ESOL classes, keeping in touch with solicitors and their families. It's also helped one person apply for a job and another to join college courses which help distract from him severe anxiety.
