"Do whatever He tells you," Mary says to the servants at the wedding at Cana. But she doesn't only say it to them. Throughout history, her words have been understood to apply to everyone, in every situation in life, great and small: "Do whatever He tells you." It's a big ask. It takes a lot of trust—in Mary and in Jesus. Mary has lived with Jesus for some thirty years now, and knows Him better than anyone else on earth. If anyone can be trusted to give us good advice about obeying Jesus, it's her.

And the whole event gives us reasons to trust Jesus. That's the whole point as far as the evangelist St John is concerned. His conclusion is, "This, the first of his *signs*, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee." We are supposed to do more than just be amazed by the miracle. We should see what it *signifies*—what it points to.

In the first place, it points to Jesus' divinity. His power to work miracles shows His almighty power beyond the limitations of this physical world. And Jesus' coming into the world as our Saviour is the greatest of God's works—"You have kept the good wine until now." Jesus chooses the setting of a wedding deliberately. It points us to the new and everlasting covenant between Christ and His Bride, the Church. And, of course we see the sign pointing to the Eucharist, when Jesus changed bread and wine into His body and blood, saying, "Do this in memory of Me." Do whatever He tells you!
